Notice of Race

36th Annual Goblin Regatta

October 25th & 26th, 2008

1. **Host and Organizing Authority**

The regatta is hosted and organized by the Santa Barbara Sailing Club.

2. **Rules**

This regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2005-2008 (RRS), the prescriptions of US Sailing, the rules of the participating classes, this Notice of Race (except as any of these are altered by the Sailing Instructions) and the Sailing Instructions.

3. **Eligibility**

This regatta is open to members of SCYA yacht clubs if they reside within the SCYA area, to members of US SAILING-affiliated yacht clubs if they reside outside of SCYA area and to sailors who do not reside in the United States but are members of their respective National Governing Authorities.

4. **Classes**

This regatta is open to Laser, Laser Radial, 29er, Optimists, International 14, Melges-24, J-24, PHRF and F-18 classes. All other one-design classes are welcome to participate. At least three (3) entrants are required to establish a class and receive a start.

5. **Entry**

Competitors may enter by filling out and returning a completed entry form and paying applicable fees (\$10 for Lasers, \$15 for boats under 20 feet, all others \$25). Entry forms for early registration may be found under the SBSC "Events" web page (www.sailsbsc.org) beginning October 15th.

6. **Schedule of Events**

Registration and Skippers Meeting will be held in the Santa Barbara Sailing Club yard.

7. **Sailing Instructions**

Sailing instructions in draft version will be available at www.sailsbsc.org on or around October 20th. The final version of the sailing instructions will be available at registration.

8. **Scoring**

Appendix A2 will apply except that when fewer than five races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of all her races scores. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series. Corrected time for the PHRF classes will be calculated using the Time On Distance scoring method.

9. **Racing Area and Course**

The racing area will be outside of the Santa Barbara Harbor. The course(s) to be sailed will be windward and leeward and variations thereof as described in the Sailing Instructions.

10. **Trophies**

Trophies will be awarded according to the following schedule: three to five boats = one trophy; six to eight boats = two trophies; nine or more boats = three trophies.

11. **Mooring and Boat Storage**

Boat and trailer storage will be made available on a first come basis beginning Friday October 24th at 16:30. Mooring is also available on a first come first serve basis in the Santa Barbara Harbor. Slip fees may apply.
